    - **PIT Issues** There was a large decrease in the unsheltered number of homeless persons, from 639 to 404. Please verify these figures, and if they are correct, please explain the decrease.

- The decrease in the number of unsheltered homeless persons from 639 to 404 (a difference of 235) can be attributed to our increased training of school systems staff, particularly in one of our largest rurally populated county Wilkes. The NWCoC covers seven rural counties in Northwestern North Carolina and thus seven school systems. CoC agencies worked with school systems to help them understand the Point In Time Count requirements for tracking homeless persons according to HUD's Homeless definition and only report students and their households who were homeless according to this definition. Also a change from 2015 to 2016 is that the unemployment rate was significantly higher in 2015 than in 2016 particularly in Wilkes leading some families into homelessness.
- There was a large decrease in the unsheltered number of persons in households with at least one adult and one child, from 492 to 257. - Our understanding of the guidance from HUD regarding Dedicated Veteran Beds resulted in our indicating too few Veterans beds dedicated.
